cator. So as long as he's over at Oakridge. This is his-business.

(Conversation between meeting leader and participant.)

Leader: But when that truck hits the site..when that truck hits the site and starts unloading. Then he has to prepare a payroll and then he has to submit it to Local. A certified payroll.

(Participant, man:) A certified payroll each week.

Leader: Right. And that's the way we have it.

(Participant, man) Who is responsible for getting this suggestion out of this wage raise from Washington?

Leader: Well, no we have it.

(Participant, man:) You have it.

Leader: We will prepare it.

(Participant, man:). They see to it that we get it.

(Laughter.) -

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Leader: You will prepare what is the going rate in your area, submit it to us and we will submit it to the labor costs.

(Participant, man:) This area might be different than the area you've been working in? So you'd have to get new ones.

Leader: No it goes by county.

(Participant, man:) That's what I say. It varies from county to county.

If you were working in another county it might not agree with it.

Leader: I'm not familiar with Canadian County but nearly all of 'ems the same in Oklahoma. Oklahoma counties...

(Participant, man:) They change. You've got to get new rates every now and then. They're only good to a certain date.

Leader: I'll check that out with this office. I'll get you some forms today and you put in what you have been paying and submit them to us, and we will see that this (not clear) in the Department of Mabor in
