They-they dance over there. Yeah, I've seen 'em there. They had a big time. They-they really got a big kick out of it. They enjoyed it and they was really in earnest about their affairs, too. And, I don't know, I can't say that they did anything--all they did was just get out there and dance and I don't know what it was all about but they'd dance and have-have a big-big time among themselves and they enjoyed it. I'm for 'em because that's what they wanted. That's-that's it.

(How often did they have dances?)

Oh, about ah-they'd have about ah two or three times a year, something like that. Sometimes maybe more. I think a lot of it was to celebrate the fact that to show their appreciation for their crops and-and what have you. Just
