

some Indian languages, and mail some letters back to him in Indian languages, and after that we understand that he had died. That's far as I know about Brother Ramsey. As I remember going to school at Brahamka Mission, I want to bring in Alice Davis, which was one of the prominent figures of the Seminole Nation. And I remember her daughters going to school there, by the name of Mildred (INTERPRETER is wrong here. Name should be Myrtle), Maud, Maud and Bessie. And as far as I know, Maud and Bessie has passed away, but the other two, that I don't remember now whether they're still living or not. (Note: at the time of the interview, Myrtle, Mrs. Eugene Aldridge, and Bessie, Mrs. V.L. Riker, were living in Wewoka.) Not only that, but I know there was several others..... Seminoles that are living around the area of Seminole county, but I suppose it's only about five or six that I can remember right off hand. Although there were several of the freedmen that went to school, but those that I do not remember any of the names, and I don't know whether they're still living or not.

As far as Wewoka Trading Company is concerned, I do remember that they used to give out what they called coupons, which was used the same as cash. And in these coupons, they were marked in little coupons denomination, from one dollar down to a penny. And that was used as cash. And anything that we wanted, as far as clothing, groceries is concerned, or food, whatever it was, why we used these at this one particular store, cause there was only one store, which is known as Wewoka Trading Company, and it was owned and managed by Jackson Brown. And also; too, that I do remember that there was one doctor in. This building, which sometime the Indians would go to, and distinctly I do remember the interpreter that he had, and the doctor had at this, his office, was freedman known as Caesar Bowlegs. He was the interpreter...he was the doctor's interpreter at that time, and course we had some of our medical attention done there, which was paid through these coupon; the same coupon we were speaking of. So this was..... the coupon was money to us, instead of actual cash. As far as the entertainment is concerned, we were not taken to anything what we call entertainment, such as
