BACKJRJUND OF INFORMANT:

Agnes Burnett was born March 30, 177... She same to Indian Territory from Kansas and settled near what is now Newkirk, Sklahoma in 100 and has fived in this same area since that time. Although Mrs. Burnett is Potawatomi, she has lived among the Kaws and associated more with them than her own tribe.
