That might have before my days. (Just had wagon andhorse back.) I used to go to stomp dance way out there to Creek Nation, you know. just go in wagon train. They call it, you know, maybe, horse back. (Where 'bouts would that have been over in the Creek Nation? Down by Muskogee was it?) Down by Gore. (Down close to Gore.) Little southwest of Gore. (Well, I bet they had a big time there, didn't they?) You bet. (That would take two days to go down there, wouldn't it?) Oh, yes, in a wagon. I went one time with a bunch from here. We stayed all night at the Green Leaf--I think they called it. Somewhere over in there, big spring. (Yeah, Green Leaf Spring.) From there, we got the stomp place, oh, about sun down. (How long do they last? Two or three days?) Two or three nights, three nights. (Three nights.) First night, they dance 'till midnight and rest. Next night, second night they dance all night.

(Yeah, them were good times, I know.)

Oh, boy.

(Was there a town there of Gore then or Webber Falls?)

No.

(No town.)
