

/Side B has more than one person talking, and causes the informant and interviewer to be inaudible at times. In certain parts, other persons contribute to the interview./

You gather them up before the /words not clear/ came around here.

(While the sap is still in them.)

And that chickory is good too, for pneumonia.

(Chickory root.)

Uh-huh.

(Does that grow around here a lot?)

Yes. It's already /words not clear/.

(Well, now the chickory root, when you gather the root, do you have to wait until it frost so the sap is down in the root and then you dig the root?)

Just anytime while it's blooming.

(Oh. And the bark, too?)

There ain't no bark. It's just a tall weed. It's got red flowers, some of them have yellow flowers..

(Uh-huh. Oh, now that's for pneumonia. Now what's the name of it again?)

Chickory roots.

(Chickory. Does it taste like chickory? That's that chickory they put in coffee?)

Huh-uh. No, different one. But some of them red root, some of them yellow.

When you pull it up you know, roots come out about that long. And cut it off, and you cut it off and put it in /words not clear/ and save it till wintertime. I used to put it in some kind of wax paper. Glad wrap.

(You just put it up and save it for winter /words not clear/.)

Yeah.

(Maybe I'll come out sometime and we'll go gather some of these herbs.)

Okay.

(That way, we'll have them when it gets wintertime.)

Uh-huh. Yeah, you have to save it because you can't find it in wintertime
