Osage agency the office of tribal guardian and tribal observer to serve as the guardian of all Osages" who are then incompetent; that the tribal grandian'si salary be set at a reasonable level and be plid from the estates to the individual guardian. If the fee is not-sufficient, the baland is to be paid from bureau funds. If the fees exceed the salary expenses, the excess is to be credited to the bureax. This centralised guardian service under the close bureau supervision elininete (inaudible) from the farm house system. We ask the government to require (words not cloar) of legislation or minutes of the council mintings be kept on superintendents and be freely available to all rimberse the tribe. The executive session be prohibited to settle matters relating to personnel. Recently thefe was council that took a large legislative program to Washington and only a favored féw had seon it. We oppose this legislation until such time it is made public. A few years afo the Osage people were excluded from the Indian hospitills; public health services are now available to them. But every Osage no matter how small the (words not clear). . We ask not only for our sakes but also for $2 l l$ tribes (inaudible) in these services, that treationt be limited to those with not less than one-fourth degree of Indian blood and their spouses and children. We ask further that the purposes of the Indian Claing Comisision Act not be perverted but payment of the Indian claims to non-Indian persons (indudible) of 0sage blood. We ask (inaudibie) be made per. cepita to reserve for program only to persons who heve one-four'th degree or more of Osage blood, "As.for (words not clear), Sentior, we ask that (words not, clear).
