BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

Lillie Hoag Whitehorn (she is married to Charles Whitehorn) is Caddo and Delaware Indian. She is about 75 years of age. Her father was Chief Enoch Hoag, Principal Chief of the Caddo Tribe. She went to school at St. Patrick's Mission School in Anadrako, Oklahoma.
