BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

Ralph Goodman was born in 1894. He is a full blood Cheyenne and is articulate in both the Cheyenne language and in English. He was brought up in the old traditional Cheyenne ways and has a great love for nature and horses. Mr. Goodman lives in Kingfisher, Oklahoma. He is one of the traditional chiefs of the Cheyenne Tribe and was elected chief in 1938. (Ralph Goodman died at his home in 1969--mc.)
