But people all over, I mean, Indian people all over Oklahoma are being notified. I imagine or probably they already know. I don't know.

"Are these camp meetings real important for the Choctaw people?"

Yes, you know, it's a religion, you know, and people really go out for it.

The Choctaw people and any. . . well, at the present time they're having a revival right out here about two miles, I think. It's all this week, so you go out there and you'll be surprised how many Indian people turn out.

"Now this one, will it be going on tonight?"

Oh yeah, it's all this week.

"I was just thinking if we weren't just real tired after tonight we might run by there and see what. . . ."

I don't know how long it will last, I imagine maybe an hour, or hour and a half or so. I think they started around 7 or 7:30.

"Is this the Methodists?"

It's the Baptists.

"Do white people come to these?"

Oh, yeah, well, like here in town, they had a revival here last weekend, this church right here on the corner, it's Methodist church. Well, it's Indian
