And he said, "Go outside," he told me. So I went out. Just, you know, right after I went out I heard a shot. He kill himself. He didn't like whatever kind of sickness he had. And I was just a little girl. He kill himself down there. I had aunts. One was Annie Road Traveller. They used to go to school here at the mission. And I had another aunt--her sister's name--I don't think she went to school but her name was Little Eyes in Indian. And then my sister, Amy--Amy Nash was her name. Before my mother got with my father--Bad Man was his name--

Um-hum. Bad Man. My name was Myrtle Bad Man when I went to school. And they all died away and I had an uncle named Ben Road Traveller. He got married down at Calumet and he died over there.
