I never did hear them.

(Are they Arapahoes too?)

Yeah, she was Arapaho.

(Now did Lump Forehead have any sisters or brothers?)

I don't know that far. I don't know. I didn't even know my grandmother. My mother just told me her name was Lump Forehead. That's how I know. Because once in a while they used to enroll these Indians, you know, up here. And her
