BACKGROUND

(What was your name before you got married?)

Scott.

(Scott?)

Uh-huh.

(Now your daddy, you say he brought you here when you were how old?)

I was fifteen. I was sixteen in the spring. We came in early spring, first year, sixteen.

(And what was it all he opened? You told me awhile ago, but I forgot.)

Oh, he brought out a store. And now you tell me when you going to turn that on. (Laughter.) I don't know. I might just say anything--

(Laughter.)

(You just go ahead and say anything. It won't make any difference. I'll let you listen to it a little bit when we get it on tape.)

Well, you want me to talk--

(Yeah, uh-huh.)

We--we bought, it was just a small little--we had tin goods, grocery store. Grocery store and a shoe shop and a restaurant was in the back of the house. This was in the front.
