BACKGROUNF OF INFORMANTS:

Lillie Hoag Whitehorn (She is married to Charles Whitehorn) is Caddo and Delaware Indian. She is about 75 years of age. Her father was Chief Enoch Hoag, Principal Chief of the Caddo Tribe. She went to school at St. Patrick's Mission School in Anadarko, Oklahoma.

Charles Whitehorn was born in 1890, between Hominy and Fairfax, by the creek known as Sycamore Creek. At the time of this interview he was Assistant Chief of the Osage Tribe. Mr. Whitehorn has been active in tribal affairs and has worked to help the Osage people. He believes that peyote made good people out of the Osages, but believes that the young people do not understand what it can do for them. He has one son and five grandchildren.
