They had ups and down, you know. But it seems like they had more better feeling. What I mean is if you was sick they willing to sit up with you all night, see. They gave all their time like that.

There's nothing in it, no money. They just want you to be satisfied.

Want you to get well. Do lot of good things like that. Now, you know, if someone stays up you gotta pay him. It's getting that hard.

(Yeah. Like you said ~~while~~ ago, in the early days they wanted to feed you and wanted you to be full. Take care of you if you needed help
