(Yeah. And the Cherokees never had big head dress either. You know have great big feather bonnets, but I never saw a Cherokee war that.)

No, I haven't saw one for a long time. Its been quite a while ago.

(Yeah.)

They're all taking up wearing style, I guess.

(All of 'em going to the style.)

Yeah.

When they have big round-up up there.

(Oh way over at Hominy. Yeah, lots of Indians there.)

Yeah, there's lot of Indians up there. Lot of Indians I know up in there, too.

I worked up there in Hominy around about Fairfax and Ralston about ^{two} year and half. I worked all around there.

(Well.. Well, you got to know a lot of Indians.)
