Naked everwhere else and their head shaved and little top back here. And I was scared to death. And he got right in the middle of the camp and stopped. And he talked to Charley Brave. That was one of the old Indians. And Charley wanted to trade horses with him.

Right there. And I crawled up in the seat, I was sitting in the back and I crawled up in the seat and I says, "My Lord, Dan, let's go on." (Laughter) I was scared to death. And we come on to town. And I had took cold that night, out here on Soldier Creek. And we stopped at Daniel Mier's wagon yard down here and put up for the night and I was just--
