

See how they're fixed--they don't drag on the ground like those Kiowa ones. I've ridden in them. They'd issue rations of flour, coffee, corn, and things like that to the Cheyennes and Arapahoes.

(Did they ever issue things at Fort Supply while you were alive?) Oh, no--that's beyond my time. This is a young man (showing another picture) that belonged to that *h'w' e'w' u' h'u' u' w'*, --a half-breed. I can't recall his name. He's related to me--he's one of the Keith boys. With buffalo meat--jerked meat.

(They used to wear these fur caps back in those days?)

Yeah. The Arapahoes started them. The Kiowas copied from us. They used to come over every spring. They know we trap lot of otter and beaver in the winter, and Indian women would tan them and them Kiowas would come--they'd lead good ponies. Trade a pony for every otter, pony for a beaver. And these Arapahoes used to wear them. Yeah, this is a fine looking boy. I think he's a Keith. He's a mixed blood--you can tell that he's a mixed blood. But he had long beautiful hair.

(Now this picture--did you know these people or where that was?)

Well, this is supposed to be a southern man from down Anadarko way. I think this is Black Kettle, and this is Ed Guerrier. This town is named after him. And I don't know this other man. But that's buffalo meat, out here--way out here towards west of Elk City. It's an old picture.

This (another picture) one of tribal chief(s)--Yellow Bear-- (These are Cheyennes?)

LITTLE RAVEN AND SELECTION OF YOUNGER CHIEFS.

Yeah, Cheyennes. This says, "Yellow Bear, Arapaho and Little Bear, brothers." (Not clear which picture he's talking about.) And this one (another picture) is Chief Bird Chief. He wouldn't sign the Medicine Lodge Treaty, no. What happened, Little Raven and him and Storm and Hawk and Chief All-Around (this name not clear on tape), they had already selected a bunch of young chiefs, including my father and Left Hand and Powder Face, so that they would retire. But when that news came out that the government was going to have a treaty with the Cheyennes and
