BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

Amos Christie is 63 years old. He is full blood Cherokee of Bitting Springs Community in Adair County, Oklahoma. Mr. Christie was born here and lives in the home built by his father. His education was obtained at Chilocco Indian School where he learned to be a plumber and has worked at various places, but returned to his original homesite to retire. He is the last of a long line of ancestors of Christie's and knows much of the family history and family cemeteries location.
