## BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

John Pedro was born in 1914 near Calumet, Oklahoma. He was reared in this area and now lives five miles north and three and one-half miles west of Calumet. He is married to the former Rosie Charcoal. They have ten children, the oldest of whom is about 33 years old and is working in Australia, and the youngest, a girl, who is 10 years old. John Pedro is very active in the Native American Church or peyote religion. He attends meetings often, and often has meetings at his home. He travels a lot, visiting peyote meetings held by other tribes, and especially liking to go north in the summer months and visit the northern Arapahoes and other northern Plains tribes.
