get killed—when they get back they're gonna go through with that Sun Dance. Mostly where those boys are dancing, you don't see nothing but veterans in there. They make a vow before they go overseas—their last furlough—that they're gonna come home and go through that Sun Dance—so they won't get killed. Our new warriors, you know. They call them soldiers, but they're our new warriors. They make a vow they've got to go through that four times, or twice, or something like that. Him—he made a vow that he was gonna put up the Sun Dance. He went over there twice. He was in Viet Nam when he got wounded—

(That Crawford?)

Yeah. He was over there quite a while several times. They finally turned him loose.

(I met him the last night. When we were leaving I whet by Josephine's camp to tell her goodby and she introduced him.)

I bet he was pretty tired.

(He looked tired, but he looked happy. And she would have invited us to eat with them but we had already eaten.)

You should have went and ate with her.

(Well, we had already eaten over at the Sankey's and -- I wish we could have eaten at both places -- )

You know, you eat a little bit here, and then you go over there and eat-Cause he's the one that put up that Sun Dance. And I think they was gonna
give away to you-all.
