(You was telling me the story about how you was on that chief's pony at one time.)

That was old--Old Redbird. His picture is out here at the souvenir shop there.

His and his horse both in there. Saw him on that white horse.

(Well, he was--was he Comanche--Redbird, or Kiowa?)

I'm not sure what tribe he was. (Field Worker asks wife if Redbird was Kiowa.)

It tells in there, on that card on his--he might be a Kiowa.

(Probably a Kiowa, visiting maybe or something like that.)

He lived right west of Cyril there about two miles. Course that would necessarily mean he was Comanche. I kinda think maybe he was. Or seem like he was.

He was related to Feared Looking Glass, seem like the family was.

(When he came in town was he in full regalia?)
