

roundhouse and depot are gone, as are the mills and plants. Three or four stores still hold on to existence. A modern box factory is the support of the community, of 313 people at last count. Most of the Indians have been pushed out by white man, and have moved west mainly to the community of Tsu-i (Chewey). This once prominent Indian community has fallen before the white man's influence and progress, and this Lapland valley no longer sees the Cherokee.
