Giggling, trot-lining, seining, bank hooks, or noodling always made for a big fish dinner. Fur trapping, and hunting wild game was another of the pleasures they enjoyed. For the most part all of these things are gone now. Joe no longer goes over to a place called Begel Bend on the river to fish, and he says "Times have changed."
