Now the words (Comanche words) they have mule colts. (Comanche word) means that it refers to the bells worn by the pack animals and what he said when he got through singing, he interpreted that song he was singing was "four days from now from the west we will see a pack of traders coming in from the west and with them they will have mule colts, the pack animals will have mule colts trotting along the side. Also the pack animals will be wearing bells." And he said, "Four days from now this lost man, this lost one that you have asked about will be riding on one of these pack animals." So, of course, up to that time, the predictions and the foretelling of this man Birdshead has been very accurate. There was no need to doubt him and so the leader, the village leader-- the people usually moved every day the Comanches usually did not stay one day at one campsite. But for this reason, Birdshead, usually, got everybody just the way he said. So they stayed, one day, two days, and then the third day, on the morning of the fourth day while they were still at this place and some of the more anxious ones went toward the direction that Birdshead had indicated, that would be the direction the traders would come from. And, close to noon, those who had been watching the horizon seen dust and they, of course, they wanted to know what was causing this dust, it was supposed to be the traders. And sure enough they headed for the direction of the dust they met this pack train. And just as Birdshead had said on one of them pack animal was riding this lost relative. And he had been wounded in the knee and had another name at the time but later on it became name for that wound. He became known as
