He has received awards at the Philbrook Art Center, Tulsa, Oklahoma Muskogee Annual Art Competition, Indian Arts and Crafts Board, Bureau of Indian Affairs, he is interested in sculpture, painting, sketching and is an official representative of the Cherokee Tribe.
