(Yeah.)

And the old man, Al Alberty, had several brothers. He run a lumber yard up there. I bought all this lumber from him. Up there one day and he was telling me about his father. They was holding court right around here at this place I was telling you about. His father was either a lawyer or a judge. I believe his father was a judge. They was having a trial. They bought U.S. Marshalls there from Ft. Smith. They brought a man up there to try him. I don't remember what the trouble was. He told me what. But there was four or five got killed there that day.

(Well.)

Started the trial, you know. Judge got killed. This Alberty, I was telling about. His father got killed sitting there in that cair. And I believe it was three-three or four more got killed besides him.

(Yeah, it seems they settled their differences the hard way.)

Oh, they did.

WHITMORE SCHOOL

(Was there a Whitmore school in this country at one time?)

Oh yeah. Building is still over there now. We--see we had--this is called Sanders district, school district.

(Yeah.)

We got school house up here. The old building is still standing up there. Little over two mile up there. And the Whitmore school house is over there yet.

'Course its new building. They tore the old one down a few years ago, and built a new building. We use it for a church house now. Just a mile, mile right east of these chicken houses down here.
