(Just yellow wood.) And the Cherokee name. (And they use Indian medicine, too.) Yeah. (Yeah.) (Mr. Terrapin's comment not clear)...they make a berry, too. (It does make a berry.) Yeah,/it would be pretty. Just black, just like blackberry--I/mean huckleberry. (Yeah.) They'll be just all over on there. (Are they good to eat?) I don't know. Never did try. (Third voice: I wouldn't want to eat 'em. /Laughter/) Well, they use them in medicine. You can make a tea out of it and drink a bit. It supposed to be good for fever. (Good for fever.) Yeah. (Yellow fever.) Uh-huh. /Words not clear/ (Vincent up here, though'.) Well. (Well, do the Indians still use it for medicine?) I never do hear of it anymore. They used to. (They used to, yeah. And then about two kinds of snake roots. Maybe three kinds. Yeah, just about every tree is used for something.) 'Course, right now, you can't find much of anything quick. 'Cause it (s all decay.

(Yeah, after it dies down, you can find it/.)
