Used to be lots of 'em around Dewey.

(Yeah.)

Dewey used to be kinda the center part of it.

(Yeah.)

And, of course, they were south towards Bartlesville, there's lot of em in there. White Turkey now, there used to be a bunch of them. Of course they've all died off. But there's quite a few White Turkey yet. (White turkey and the Long Bones.)

Yeah, quite a few of those. Yes,

just scattered around just here and there. First one place--lots of 'em gone different places. Lot of 'em work, you know, got'em out. (Let's see where was the Beaver family from? Were they up in here?) Well, there's some--well there's one, just one woman over there now. That's Beaver's wife. Was Beaver's wife and was brother's wife. She's over at--She lives over east of here. Right north of Warren. All them stores there, west of Warren. She's hardly ever there. Just there part time. Her mother lives down there in Anadarko. She come down there or up there. I see her when she's up here. (Yeah.)

Yeah, that's ture. Beavers about all died out. MUCH PRAIRIE LAND IN EARLY DAYS - TIMBER NOW

(Did you ever hear your daddy tell about what this country was like way; back before they started settling it up?)

No, he never did say too much about it. (I just wondered if it was all lots of prairie or woodland.) There's quite a bit of prairie there.

(Yeah.)

Yeah. Pretty all prairie. Lot of timbers growed up in here in the last forty of fifty years.
