No, he lived over west of Dewey.

(West of Dewey.)

Yeah, yeah. I don't know, he just always live there, after he come down from Kansas. Then he had a half-brother name of She-She. I've got a cousin over by Welsh. New Welsh. Another Kaw, his name is She-Shee, Bill She-Shee. Only She-Shee left. And he had a son, but he got killed someway. I think he died anyway. And that was the only She-Shee there was and he said he guess that when he died that would be the end of She-Shee. (That would be the first road east of Big Creek Bridge and then north.) First house. (static - words not clear) (See, he's the last of the She-Shees.)
When he dies, that's the end of that. (tape skip)

In business, I believe. They did have a restaurant up there.

(Yeah.)

I think they still got it.

(Yeah.)

Last time I ask. Had a little cafe there over to White Oak now. They'll be over there right there. You know where stomp ground is. Well, it willbe there. I imagine about the first Saturday in October you might get it. Randy knows. Randy could tell you when it will be.
