Sometimes they did. They carried small bags. He would give us medicine but some of us didn't have clock. We borrow it to give medicine by the time. We had to find someone that knew how to give it.

(Were there lots of Indian doctors them days?)

Yes, each one was good for different sickness. They'd doctor Indians whether they were going get well or not. We use to see fortune tellers and she or he would suggest which doctor should doctor, and tell what was the kind of sickness one had. They would tell us what to eat and not to eat and other things.

(How about now? Is there any Indian doctors?)

There may be few.

(You said if one was going to live or not. When one died; how did they put them away?)

We had home-made caskets. Kinda sharp or small at the ends. Put white fine material inside and cover it with black material on outside. We made clothes (sew it) for man or woman. They put handkerchief on their eyes. After it's fix up they put the casket on logs across dug grave and view the body. (Now days they view the body in church or chapel.)

(Did they embalm the body?)

No, they didn't. But they took red clay off of a log house, weeds, and salt, mix it and doctor it and put it (warp it up.) on the stomach. So the body wouldn't swell up.

(What about the handkerchief on the eyes? Was it because they had eyes open?)

N, they put nickel on the eyes to shut them up. They put handkerchief on the eyes till viewing the body time came.

(How about the quilt they put on them.)

They use to put quilt on bottom of casket till here not so long ago, they
