SUNDAY SERVICES, MORNING SERVICE

(For about two minutes, a speaker is speaking in an Indian language. Then, the congregation sings a song in Indian for about five minutes. Again, a speaker is speaking in Indian for about seven minutes. Then, a short song in Indian is sung, and the speaker continues to speak in Indian for about two minutes. In the next three minutes, the congregation sings another song.)

COMMENTS BY FIELD WORKER

(This is a recording taken during Sunday evening, preaching service, at West Eufaula Indian Paptist Church near Eufaula, Oklahoma, September 21, 1969. With Reverend John M. Tiger presiding, many Creek hymns were sung and prayers made before the time was given to Reverend Willie Kelly, pastor of Okfuskee Indian Baptist Church to deliver a sermon. Invitation is made after sermon. One comes forward, and at this time, prayer was being made to receive the subject by the church and encouraged. At this point, my recording was interrupted. So, between now and until the next hymn which will be, when the congregation will be given the right kind of church fellowship to the one coming for rededication. Rest of the evening service will follow.)

(Singing of hymn in Creek Indian language lasts for about three minutes. Several voices speaking Creek for about five minutes.
