EXPLANATORY NOTE: T-521 is a tape made at the Sunday afternoon performance of the 1969 Hub City Pow-wow and includes the opening activities and announcements, the gourd dances, processions, and other special songs, and some of the specials. There were many specials or giveaways scheduled for this afternoon, and many were not recorded. This manuscript is a description of the contents of this tape based on listening to a playback of the tape and transcribing certain speech portions and noting the events taking place. I attended all three days of this year's pow-wow and camped on the grounds between the James Anquoe, Jr. and James Anquoe, Sr. families. Some notes were made on the activities for all three days and are included as an appendix to this manuscript, as they illustrate something of the nature of the whole pow-wow.--J. Jordan.
