No, I don't. Grandpa used to kind of hardly tell us nothing. But Uncle Hicks (Boyiddle) might know something. Cause he's been, well we all been raised up around there, and I was telling Judy (Jordan) that there were some round rocks on top of that mountain, (near Zodlton) about half way. The biggest one you find is about like that (a large marble). And they just round, like marbles. From the spring, you climb that mountain, and not quite half way, it kind of goes down a little. Well right in there. We used to go up there and get them, well, I used to go up there and get for my uncle, to tie his drum. Lot of them. I don't
