know if it's there yet, or not. Sure was a lot of them there. We used to take a sack. They heavy, but we drag them back. (What about that cave you were talking about?)

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Well, I don't know. It's been there a long time, but I went where it was, but I never went in. My brother went in, and a bunch of little boys went in there. But seems like, I'd sit down and kind of peep in there, and seems like it was kind of dripping water, from that cave, you know.

(Several minutes of irrelevant conversation.)

It (Zodlton) used to be deep, when I was about like, anyway, I must of been eight or nine years old, and we used to go swimming. And where I was talking about, them two mountains together like that, the creek runs. Well, clear up to the north end of the mountain, well there was a big round rock, I don't know how tall it is. About as tall as a door, I guess. It's a big round rock, and that rocks just sticks out.a little. I never did jump off there, but the older ones did, and that water was deep. And I went down there a few years later, and don't you know, that creed was just dry and that rocks was just setting out there. No water.

(Did people who wanted to be doctors ever go out to Zodlton?) I don't know. I wouldn't know anything about that, but I know that a lot of old Indians went out there, you know, and used it for different things.

(What kinds of things?)

They use ft for different things. I don't know. My grandma used to say it was good for fever, she say she want to drink it. She try to make me drink it one time. And then some peoples have hear rash, some-
