Don't you know, there was trouble between the whites and the Indians, since the treaty, Medicine Lodge Treaty in 1852, I believe. Anyway, it was that year. And this happened in 1874 somewhere along there, and I got to get those confirmed. This story.

Cache Creek Cemetery. Anyway, I put in a request (to have him reburied) for three or four years. They going to take care of it. He's no renegade. Make peace between the whites and the Indians.

(Does anyone know where Apache John is buried?)

He's at Ft. Sill. He was a scout, and many like him, like Sankadote, he was buried there, too. They went after my grandpa. And those stories don't correspond with some of this literature they put out, about the last wars. Cheyenne and Kiowa's, they don't say nothing about my grand-
