And then they send us to Eufaula, down here. I went there about two years I think.

And I just had to quit because papa--after mama died, papa didn't do much good you know. He couldn't buy no clothing for us, you know. So that's how come me to have to quit school.

(Oh.)

I had to stay home and keep house. Daddy was awful good to stay with us. But seem like after mother died, it well, seem like we had plenty you know but after she died seem like everything just--everything go away from us. (Oh. Did you say your mother was a teacher?)

Uh-hun. Taught school. She went to Memphis, Tennessee.

(She did?

Uh-huh. She graduated up there.

(Well, what else did you do when you was in your younger days? Can you think of something else that kind of--you could think about it sometime, you know.)
