(Did Indians play fiddle!)

They has Indian music, not white peoples way.

(What about this Indian stomp dance? Did they have ribbon dance or something?) They'd have two or three stomp dances and in July they have green corn stomp. dance. They meet, get together, set the date, they set the date with little wooden stick. They stick it in ground some certain way to set the date. They all get together, and women have ribbon dance right before stomp dance: The have ribbons hanging on their dresses and beaded arm band. Ribbon dance leaders carries a butcher knife stick, with red feathers on end. Some wears turtle Two men sits on south arbor, and rattles the rattler and they dance. They start about 9 or 10 and quit at 12 and after that they go and bathe in water (If there's any water), if not they take sponge bath the's talking' about Indians having to go off and work to support family). If any Indian was born certain place, they don't like to leave. Indians were forced to leave their place. White man force the Indians to leave, like me, Uncle Sam made me leave home to go to Army. They like to stay home place. But like now, Indians have to leave home and go to bis town to look for job. hunt like we used to and we can't farm either, cause farm equipment cost high White people chase our meat away such as deer and wild tarkeys, etc. Our chickens too. If we stay there, they'd starve to death. That's why they have to leave home wo work. (How they were disciplined) They used to spank the girls, he (mu father) used to have sticks under the porch and used to spans thé girls even if they were old. I guess they wanted to go see b ys. have nieces and nephew--I'm their uncle, they used to tell us to obey the older ones getting after you and you'd have a good life. They used to tell as watch out for yourself, 'cause you may be around where crime is committed and you'd get involve.

(Those days, those Indians were pretty close together weren't they? They visit one another if someone were sick or something?).
