I wish they hurry and get us water.

(Yes, you all need well worse than anything. (laughter) First part, I told her to talk in English or Creek 'cause Creek and Seminole are same language, so Mary Green is talking in Creek and Seminole. It's just about up. Say what you want to say: Well, I'm here and I know you need help.)

Yes, you almost fell off the porch and if I don't have house fix, white man may come and fall off and sue me, that's what they like to do--

(Listen to recorder for finish.)

(That's right too. (Indian Language spoken for few sentences.) Yeah. Well, we enjoyed visiting you and your husband. And I understand what you mean by needing help. And I hope you can get something done for your home and help for your children, because they do need education. And whatever way I can help, I'll try to find out a few things for you so that you can get some help—such as fixing your house up and getting the water. But I am pretty sure that they will come around to this area later on.
