Yeah. Over there on the west side. Little sticks and that buffalo. Used to be there.

(What were those sticks made of?)

Willows.

(Seems like the ones I saw were painted?)

Well, they paint them. It's willow, but they paint them red.

(Did they have a cedar tree there? Did they use a cedar tree in there?)

Yeah. Cedar tree. And then cottonwood. That the only--it's just like it. There ain't no difference in it.

(Here in Oklahoma--I know up there they went out and got some kind of grass to put around the outside--)

Well, over here they used to use cottonwoods outside. Cottonwoods. But over there they got different kind of trees, you know. And they use them. They just like cottonwoods. But down here they used to use cottonwoods.

(When they used to have the Sun Dance here, did any of the Wyoming Arapahoes used to come down?)

Oh yeah, they used to come down. There used to be lot of them.

They used to all come down.

(Did they used to dance in it?)

No, not that I know of. I never did see a Wyoming (man) dance.

(What about Indians from other tribes here in Oklahoma--did they used to come and watch the Sun Dance?)

Yeah, they used to--Kiowas used to dance with them. Some two or three of them used to dance. I don't know their names.
