Yeah, and these grandpas, if they tell anything to their grandson, he's go to do it. He's not supposed to refuse.

(Is that the way it used to be back here in Oklahoma?)

Yeah. It used to be like that them.

(You know back here in Oklahoma when they used to have it, what kind of food did they used to take in for the grandfathers?)
