They moved it down here along about--oh, it must have been sometimes probably around World War I--before or after. I really don't remember when they first moved it down here. So, it must have been before. And they moved the post office down here and they called it Qualls.

(Do you recall who some of the postmasters were at--those early days?)

Yeah. There was a woman lived down here. Her name was Jensie Powers. She was first postmaster I remember down here--first one. That's been way back about 1918 along in there.

(Yeah)

The man who ran it lived at this little old place over there called Zeb.

(Yeah, I remember Zeb.)

Well, he carried to Zeb and there's a man carried it from there. He brought it on across on a horse--here and back.
