CHURCHES

And in 1927 just down here at the edge of the camp they built a church house that stood there up then till 1942. Everybody moved out. And then they had church out here in this building a while. Before then it was just school houses and they'd make a place outside for cool weather and have church.

LIVING MADE BY FARMING AND RAISING CATTLE

(How did the folks make a living down through here in earlier days?)

Well, they farmed. Back up till 1942 everybody in here they had small farm. Didn't take much to pay 'em then. Didn't have much expenses only just like now didn't have no real expenses. Didn't have to buy no gasoline or anything like that. Just very few--just necessities.
