go down there. Cherokee writing then he'd send it to me and I couldn't hardly read it. I had to get some more Indians (not clear)

(Yeah)

Explain to me just what it says.

(Never could find it though.)

He found the tombstone, but somebody had it right there in-he found the tombstone all right but he (not clear) away from the grave, you know. Had it for steps, he said. Just like this tombstone. Just lay it down on it (not clear). They wouldn't know where you got it. That's just the way he did.

(No, once you move 'em. It's hard to put 'em back to where they are.)

Had to put it back. Yeah, that's (static-tape, not clear) one time (static)

all the Cherokee writing.

(Oh, yeah, the one they call it the jumper?)

Yeah, I guess that's the name of it.

(Yeah, I found it that way.)

That was the old grave.

(Oh, that one is an old, long time ago.)

Homemade.

(Yeah, homemade.)

(Not clear) working on the road. I was working for the county, you know. We came out on that -- on the road.

(And then one time way east of there old Swimmer place there's a little bitty one there too.)

There is?

(Uh-huh.)

(Tape skip)

People there.
