day that, they will realize this. And it's mostly the ones that haven't had an education. What I mean, you know, can really understand what you're trying to bring across to them. The ones that has gone to school before-it's not hard to bring across to them and let them realize that you do have to change with time. And time is changing. It's getting very short for our Maker to return, and we must be ready when He comes. I'd like to have said a lot about the Indian ways in which we lived and all this. But like I say, as far as stomp dances, my mother didn't allow us to go to stomp dances. And I do know that during this time, way back, I imagine, not now, because we're educated to a point where we know that this isn't the way that we worship our Then, the time back in my grandfather's time, I see where they know. I knew that there was One higher than we. And that these ceremonies that they went through that they were showing the Lord their appreciation and all But now, we have our churches and all this. And to me, all these things that appeal to me--like I say, it may seem funny, not really funny; but it may sound kind of odd for me to say something like this. But all this does not appeal to me one bit. Like I say, it's environment that I was brought up in, and as my mother and father raised me. All this doesn't-it just doesn't appeal to me. And others can go on to stomp dances and have a nice time and all this. And someone says to me; "Have you been to any stomp dances?" And I say, "No, I don't. I don't have the slightest idea." I said, "Why should I?" And they just think all the "Well, you should." Indians should know all this stuff. And I just -- I don't know why they feel this way. They feel like we are losing our culture. In a way, to a certain extent; I guess we are, but I feel you sort of have to lose part of this in order to go forward. I mean, this is good to really go back and to discuss all these things that people used to do a long time ago, which is very interesting, which is history. But you can't continue on that same little
