(What's the Apache name for this?)

About next month those things are going to turn into stickers. There is a certain place where they really grow, but right here you can't hardly find them. In them hills they're different from this. I mean in the sand country, different soil like in thight land loose country. They got different, they turn different.

(The same plant?)

Yeah, they, well I don't know, but they way we know them, the same thing. Rich soil and poor soil the same thing, but they different soo? Therefore, I was going to show you some of these things, but you go to the sand country you will see the same thing but a little different. Like these in Texas, oh, they grow like this. You seen them.

(Great big (prickly pear) ?)

Yeah and some of them don't have a sticker on them. That's the one they feed to the cattles.

(Oh, yeah.)

Horses. They ain't got no stickers on them, they're just slick. Therefore they get a knife, and they chop them and I mean cattle go for them. Them really got some fine stickers on them.

(That's prickly pear?)

Yeah, prickly pear. They in catcus family.
