(By the way, what school did you folks have down in the Fisher Bend country?) Well, there was a place they called Yellow Springs down there, and the first school I ever remember.

But I didn't go to school there. But I think my older sisters went and then the Valley School was on back east there. It was built after that school closed down. And then I went from there on to--I went to school at the Valley. I remember we moved up on this lease farm there and I went from there for the rest of my school to another school down there. They called it Morris Spring. Billy Moore lived there east. He is full-blood. There was the big spring right below his house there. The school house was west there of his house, oh, a quarter of a mile, I guess. And the name of that school was the Bibly Moore Spring. I went the rest of my schooling right there.

(Un-hum.)

Well, there's not too many white kids going to school there. Them were Indians.

(Yeah.)

More Indians than was white kids.
