PROMINENT INDIAN FAMILIES

Well, let's see here, forty-five, that may be it, forty-five.

(The Pratt family, they were Shawnees, too.)

Yeah. I guess that is it, too. It is in forty-five.

(They show one here.)

Twenty-three, that's Captain, I believe.

(Yeah, that's Captain.

(Yeah. That's Tom Captain's family, which is also a Shawnee.)

This one is recorded. I didn't think it was. But I'll show you one that isn't recorded here. And it's a very historical place. Now there's Wyandotte.

(Yeah. This shows Wyandotte reservation here. I imagine just this little area here.)

Lawson family.

(Lawson.)

This one isn't recorded because I looked on here before. Right here what they call the Ozark ranch and factory. They--the reason I know it, of course, let me check this. Mildred's grandfather is living on the place. Zane. Zane is a very prominent name with the Wyandottes.

(What's the last name?)

Zane. Now, I don't know where it's at. Now, there is where the Ozark range is now. Almost they're headquarters. If you're ever through there just go to the Ozark range and go right there to the
