Where that old ferry was is they called it Frozen Rock Ferry.

And on the south side of the road is some little plot of graves there that were left there during—in 1864. That's the Civil War, you know.

Right down about a quarter of a mile from the ferry was a old log house. Hewed logs. It had one of those big breezeways. 'Course it was an extra large one. And they said, during the Civil War they used that for a hospital. It was that large.
