MANY SMALL TRIBES--LOCATIONS

(not clear--static)--and I just counted off the times when just naming them but--

(Let's see that would be the Quapaw.)

(Not clear)--you know, start with the Quapaw (not clear) race, Ottawas, Eastern Shawnees and the Modoc, Wyandotte, and (not clear) what you call them. But at one time we did have the Nez Pierces here.

(Well and their schedule, what part of the country did they come from?)

They came from--oh--

(Was that that Idaho--)

I think that was the Idaho--

(Idaho)

The Indians there. They come in here but they wasn't in here too long.

Fellow passed away by the name of King and was telling me that they lived over here on Flint Creek. And I imagine Tom Captain can probably tell you all about them.

(He probably could.)

(Yeah, I'm going to go by and visit him again one of these days.)

Tom, you know you have to have a little something to refer to. (not clear) I found that also that others have a record to refer to.

(Yeah.)

Will have a little time to refer to now and then, bhy it would tell me more. Now the Poncas were in here for just a short time.
